The Pastor's Pen

Plucking Thistles, Planting Flowers

As spring begins and the world around us blooms, I have been thinking about this Abraham Lincoln quote, *“Die when I may, I want it said of me by those who knew me best, that I always plucked a thistle and planted a flower where I thought a flower would grow.”* In fact, by the time you read this you may have already heard it in a sermon. April brings with it the beauty of spring, the renewal of Easter, and a reminder that new life is always possible through Christ. What a profound statement about living a life that seeks to bring goodness and beauty into the world, rather than allowing negativity and hardship to take root.

Lincoln's words challenge us as individuals and as a church community. Are we plucking thistles, or are we allowing them to spread? Are we planting flowers where they have the best chance to thrive? As followers of Christ, we are called to be people who cultivate love, grace, and kindness in a world that can often feel overgrown with division, despair, and hardship.

One of the greatest examples of plucking thistles and planting flowers comes from Jesus Himself. Throughout His ministry, Jesus uprooted hatred and fear, replacing them with love and faith. When He encountered the sick, He offered healing. When He met the lonely, He gave them a place of belonging. When He found sinners, He forgave and restored them. Jesus calls us to do the same in our daily lives.

During this Lenten season and as we move ever closer to Easter, let's examine our own lives. What are the “thistles” that need to be removed from our hearts? Maybe it's a grudge we've been holding onto for too long. Maybe it's a habit of criticism rather than encouragement. Maybe it's the tendency to focus on what's wrong in the world rather than what is beautiful and full of hope. Whatever those thistles may be, let's commit to pulling them up by the roots and replacing them with acts of love, kindness, and faith.

As a church, we also have an opportunity to plant flowers in our community. Every time we welcome a new visitor, support a struggling family, or offer a word of hope to someone in need, we are planting seeds of Christ's love. Every time we serve in missions, uplift the brokenhearted, or teach our children the love of God, we are cultivating a garden that reflects the beauty of God's kingdom.

This month, I encourage you to think about one specific way you can pluck a thistle and plant a flower. Maybe it's reaching out to a neighbor who needs a friend. Maybe it's volunteering in a ministry you've been feeling called to join. Maybe it's simply choosing to speak words of encouragement rather than criticism. Small acts of faith and love have a way of growing into something much greater than we could ever imagine.

Wouldn't it be great if Saint Paul was known for the flowers we plant? Let's be a church that sows seeds of hope, faith, and love wherever we go. May it be said of us that we left the world a little more beautiful, a little more kind, and a little more full of Christ's love.
